The M.G. Car Company very consistantly provided part numbers on many of the individual parts in the car. In particular, there are many small castings fastened to the chassis. An example is the crosspiece for the front motor mount. Each piece that is a part of the chassis has an "EX 120 _ _ "(plus two other numbers). Mr. Perman has discovered from some M.G. History books that the EX 120 chassis was copied with only small changes, if any, for the J-series. The last two numbers after the "EX 120" must be the individual part number for that piece.

In fact I felt very sorry for one of our fellow J2 owners who purchased a set of J2 seats from this dealer that are not to original specifications. The seats were missing the flaps on the outside edge of the seat backs to cover the hood frame when it is in the down position. This same dealer is selling seat rails for the J2 which are like those used on the later T-series cars. The J2 did not have seat rails!

Never-the-less, I must deal from time to time with this same parts dealer. I do not like to deal with him when he is mad at me since people are name dropping with my name in trying to resulve questions or problems.
